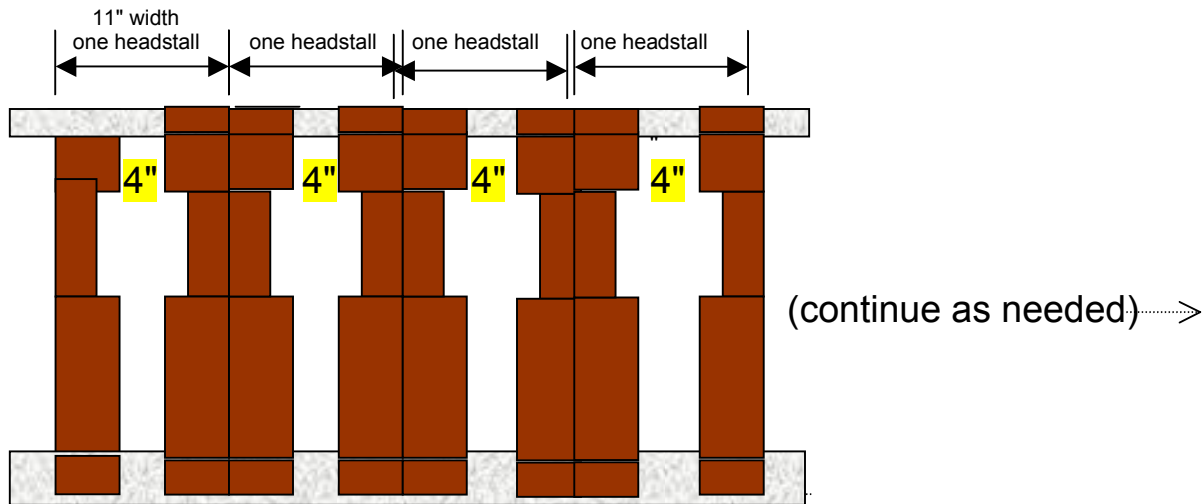


Headstalls (pallet board) different applicatons

Adapted from Adam Van Den Busch's pallet style feed bunk

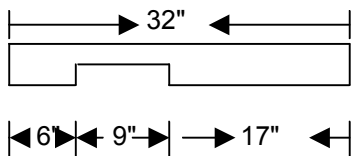
Making the headstall units

(Each pallet board is 3 1/2" wide at the widest part. One headstall is composed of two 3 1/2 boards with a 4" space between them for a total of 11".)



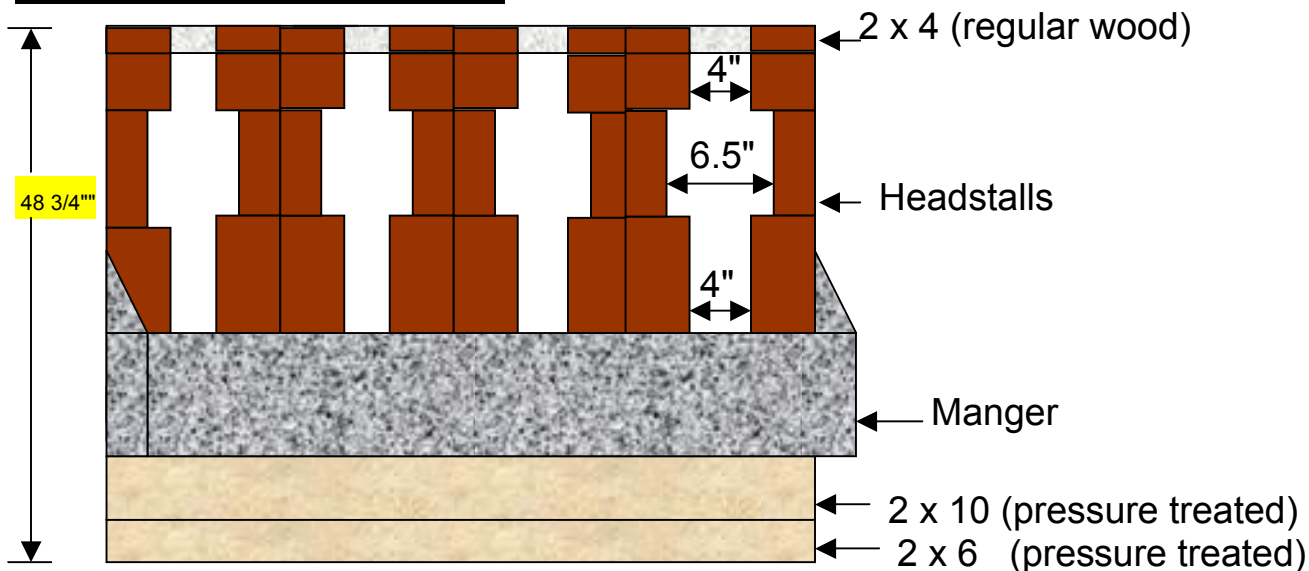
1" space open at bottom to make it easy to run a shovel down the feed bunk to clean it.

Cutting Diagrams for Headstall Boards

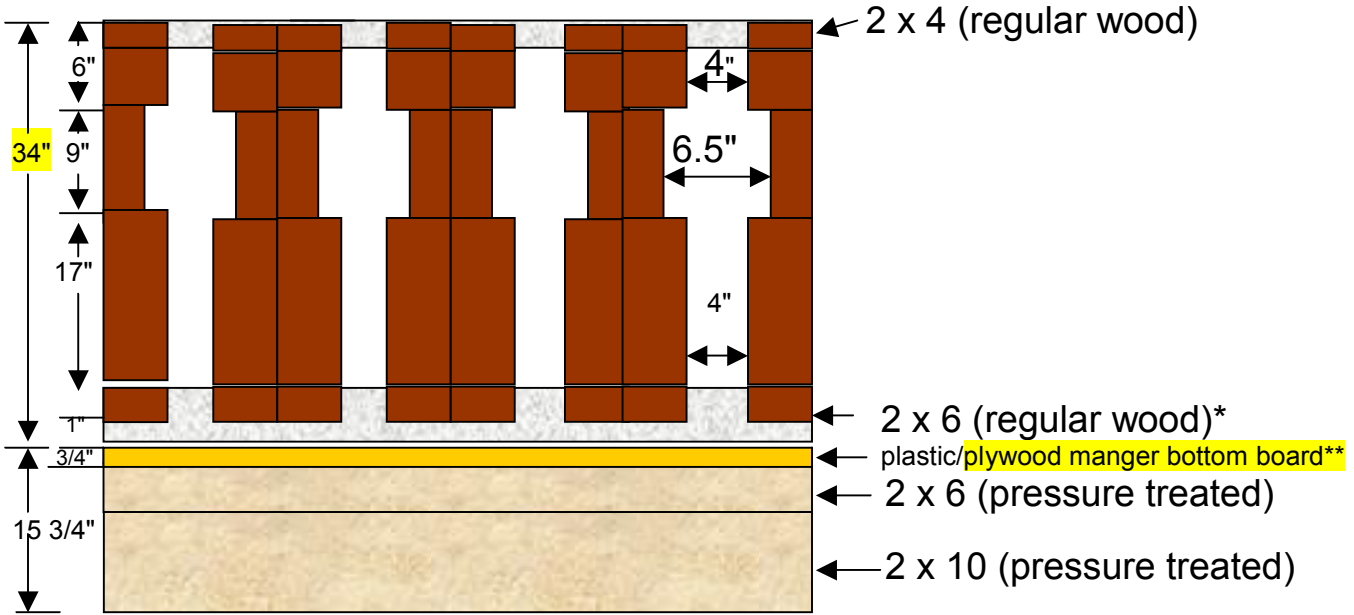


Cut two for each headstall. Place as in diagram above.

Feed bunk section with manger:

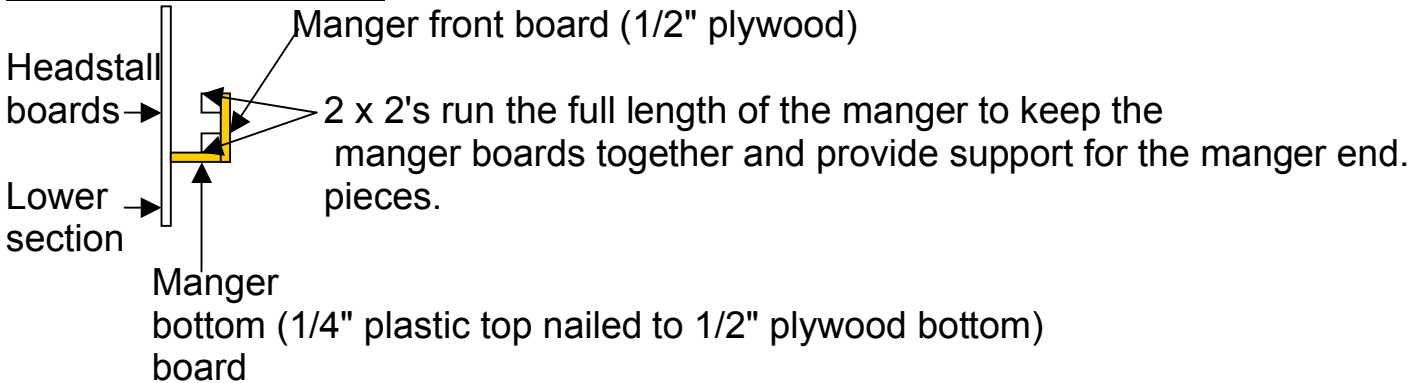


Feedbunk section without manger:

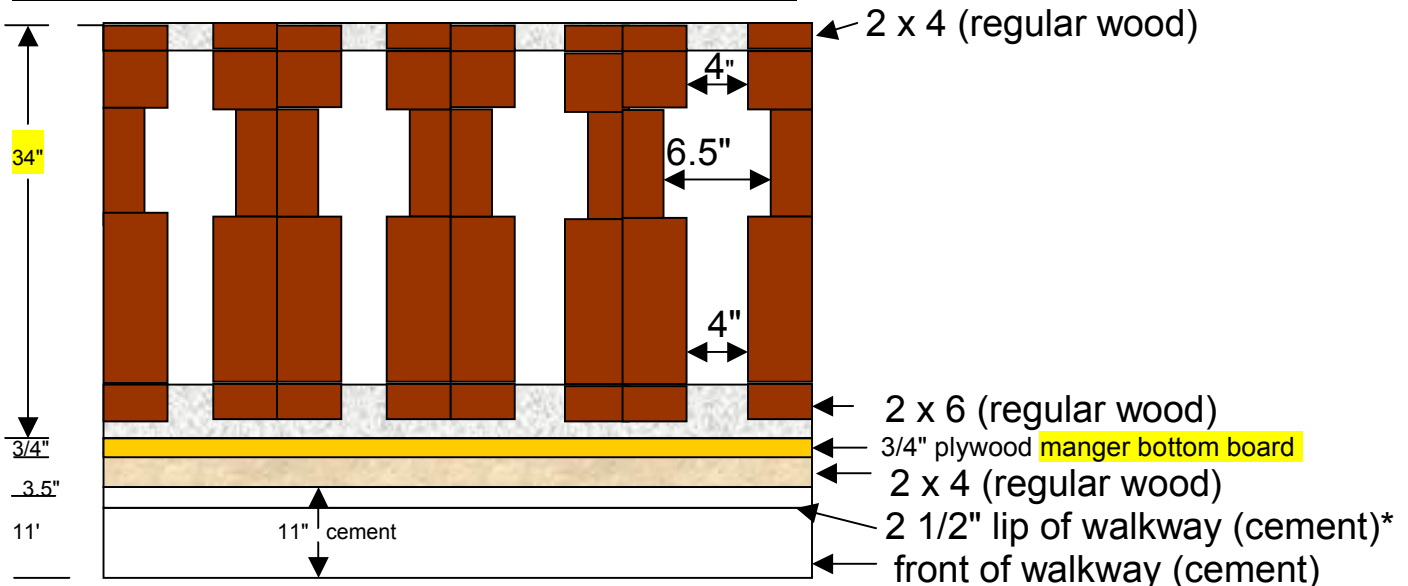


* Headstalls are placed 1" up from bottom edge of board ** 1/4 plastic boards is applied to plywood before assembling unit

Side view of the manger:



Feed Bunk Fence placed on raised cement platform



* lip sticks out 2" from front of walkway.

The total height of the wooden part of the unit is 37 1/4", and it sits on top of the cement and is attached to treated 4x4 posts. You can attach 4 x 4 posts to the floor wherever you need them by bolting a 4 x4 post support from Menards.to the cement floor of the barn. Place them so that you can run the 4 x 4 up to the ceiling and bolt them to the rafters for stability.
